



Gabrielle's Angel Foundation – Mark Foundation Collaborative Grant Award Guidelines

Gabrielle's Angel Foundation and The Mark Foundation for Cancer Research announce the development of a collaborative research program involving investigators currently or previously funded by Gabrielle's Angel Foundation. This award presents those proven and accomplished researchers with the opportunity to explore new ideas together in a collaborative setting.

ELIGIBILITY: All current and former Gabrielle's Angel Foundation grantees who have previously received a three-year Medical Research Award (**Conventional Grants only**) are invited to apply. Please view [this list](#) for names and contact information of current/former grantees for outreach purposes.

- Teams of up to 3 investigators are permitted, but at minimum 2 of the 3 must be prior Medical Research Award grantees
- This opportunity is open to those who are currently receiving funding from Gabrielle's Angel Foundation, however the project must be based on a new idea or an extension of the current project with unique aims.

AWARD TERMS:

- This award offers a team of 2–3 researchers \$250,000.00 per year for a total of \$500,000.00 over two years.
- After one year of the study is completed, the team must submit a progress report – both scientific and financial – to the Foundation office. These reports will be reviewed by the Medical Advisory Board for approval for the second year of funding.

SUBMISSION PROCESS:

- The first stage of the application is a Letter of Intent. The initial Letter of Intent should include:
 - Project Title
 - Project Summary: description of the proposed project, including a concise discussion of the rationale, experimental approach, innovation, and potential impact (maximum of 2 pages)
 - Statement of Project Distinction: brief paragraph describing how the proposed project is unique from prior research activities, particularly those funded by Gabrielle's Angel Foundation
 - Collaboration Statement: description of how the project investigators plan to work together, how roles will be divided, and the importance of this particular collaboration
 - Maximum combined length Statement of Project Distinction and Collaboration Statement: 1 page
- Applicants must also provide a biosketch (NIH format or similar) and a list of current grants and other funding supporting each of the labs
- After the Letters of Intent have been evaluated, full applications will be accepted by invitation only.

SUBMISSION TIMING: Electronic Letter of Intent submissions must be received by Friday, February 17th, 2023 to grants@gabriellesangels.org. Select members of Gabrielle's Angel Foundation's Medical Advisory Board and representative(s) of The Mark Foundation for Cancer Research will review all submissions to determine which teams will be invited to submit full applications. All applicants will be notified of the results via email.

BUDGET INFORMATION:

- Overhead expenditures and direct costs are not to exceed ten (10) percent (inclusive) of the total grant award of \$500,000.00.
